- Assessment conditions
Practices for first aid (knowledge and skills) must be consistent with the current version of the *First Aid as a Life Skill* document.

Competence will be demonstrated using a different simulated first aid incident developed by the training provider. At least one of these scenarios must include a situational hazard, and one must include a reduced level of response when the person is breathing normally (singly or in combination).

Accepted practices for first aid include recognising when to call for help, and simple management of condition(s).

The training provider's assessment or incident checklist must make reference to specific information on how each first aid situation and each person's injuries and medical conditions are expected to be managed.

The assessment or incident checklist must cover aspects such as management of injuries and/or medical conditions - what the learner is expected to do in each situation.

- Definition
Situational hazards – electrocution, bodies of water, fire, hazardous chemicals, biological risks, presence of bodily fluids, the weather, road traffic accidents, gas contaminated environments.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Provide first aid.

Performance criteria

1.1 The person's condition is assessed and managed according to practices outlined in the *First Aid as a Life Skill* document.

Range person's condition includes:
one trauma from – burns, fractures, dislocations, soft tissue injuries, poisoning;
two medical conditions from – heart attack, asthma, stroke, seizure, diabetes.
